Message from the President

Service to the sick and needy of the community was the primary objective of Sevakshetra Hospital when it was officially inaugurated in the year 1979. Even though **Canara Bank Relief and Welfare Society (CBR&WS)** had initiated health care by starting a Medical Centre in the year 1962, through which medical camps were conducted in nearby rural areas, the formal five bedded Sevakshetra Hospital came into existence after nearly seventeen years. Since then Sevakshetra has expanded its health care services by its community friendly policies and projects. Affordable charges, availability of specialists, concession to BPL card holders, Geriatric Care to the aged and in need of constant medical care, etc. have made Sevakshetra, a 'Hospital with a humane approach'.

Now, to minimize the suffering of people with life threatening diseases, and to provide accessible palliative care, with a goal to reach such individuals from socio-economically humble backgrounds, Sevakshetra Hospital and Swami Vivekananda Youth Movement (SVYM) have recently entered into a partnership model to provide Palliative Care for bed ridden patients in Bengaluru.

Palliative care is a specialized medical care that aims to improve the quality of life and reduce suffering for people with serious lifethreatening illnesses. It focuses on providing relief from pain and other symptoms of serious illnesses from the stage of diagnosis until the end of their life.

Sevakshetra Hospital has extended the ward and laboratory facilities, five beds with basic infrastructure. SVYM is extending support with a qualified Palliative Care Physician and specially trained Palliative Care nurses, counsellor and health workers under their Palliative Care Program.

For this purpose an MOU was signed by both the Institutions on August 16, 2024 to carry forward this collaborative venture. This Palliative Care Centre, started with the collaboration and cooperation of Sevakshetra and SVYM, will benefit many needy people.

Teachers' Training Programme

BRC conducted a four-day residential Program for teachers working in the Schools for the blind in Karnataka from July 24-27, 2024. Twenty-three teachers from 13 schools across the State participated. The program included daily sessions with practical teaching methods and tools. Participants found the training beneficial. We also received valuable feedback from participants. A brief note on the sessions conducted is shown below:

July 24 - By Smt. Savitha & Smt. Indu from Vividha Trust

The popular teaching aid Globe was presented to help in understanding the concept of a round earth with continents, oceans, countries, latitudes and longitudes and the polar regions. The practical teaching method adopted to teach the students was well appreciated, especially Mathematical concepts.

July 25 - By Smt. Rajyashree Satish

Significance of Braille and Language: The importance of Braille, language, vocabulary in Kannada and translations were emphasized in this session. The participants appreciated the session.

By Smt. Rakhi Aithal: Games Based on Language: To add the fun element in teaching, Smt. Rakhi conducted games for the participants. This session was informative and was enjoyed by all the teachers. The games were quite simple and could also be implemented in their schools.

By Shri. Basavaraj: On Nemeth Code: This session was welcomed by the participants who were new to Nemeth code. They also wanted more examples and some more work by solving the problems using Taylor frame.

July 26 - By Shri. Sharanappa Biradar

On Sethubandhu: the topic of 'Sethubandhu' (Bridge course) as stipulated by the Govt. Dept. for the Empowerment of Differently Abled & Senior Citizens was emphasized in this session. Shri. Biradar also explained the rules and regulations, which help the teachers teaching in schools for the blind. The session was found very informative by the participants who praised the session.

By Smt. Annapurna: Module System and Managing the Students in the Classroom: Smt. Annapurna provided effective strategies for adopting teaching methods, managing student behaviour and ensuring personal well-being, such as vocal chord rest techniques which was appreciated by the Teachers.

By Smt. Kalyani Pai & Smt. Rakhi Aithal: On BRC tactile books: BRC tactile books "Aha Karnataka", "BalaJagathu" and "Navilugari" were circulated among participants. Some Science books, Math tables, 'Wonder Braille - Kannada braille & Varnamale' were also shown. These books were found good and interesting by the participants.

July 27 - By Shri. Srinivasa Murthy

Braille Apps: Shri. Murthy encouraged teachers to download the Braille Recognition app and experiment with a sample. This app can scan printed Braille and instantly translate it for sighted users. Many teachers installed the app and tested it with Braille images. He also discussed Optical Braille Scanners (similar to OCR) for reading Braille books and highlighted other apps designed for visually impaired individuals.

The Valedictory function was conducted on 27th July, 2024. Shri. D.S. Anandamurthy, Hon. Secretary, CBR&WS and Shri. K.S.S. Kamath, General Manger-CBR&WS, distributed the certificates to the trainees. Participants shared their experience and explained how the training helped them to enhance their teaching abilities / skills through new technologies relevant for visually challenged students. Story books, tactile books, science books, etc. transcribed in Braille were distributed to all the 13 schools.

Quiz for Students of Degree Colleges

Mathruchhaya Braille Resource Centre conducted a Quiz programme for students with visual impairment, studying in Degree Colleges on October 19, 2024. About 48 students from various colleges of Bengaluru studying in their first, second and third year Degree courses participated.

The students were divided into 10 groups with 4-5 members in each group. The groups included students from all participating colleges, ensuring interaction among them. The Quiz was designed and conducted by Dr. B.R. Guruprasad, Ex-Space Scientist from ISRO and present Director of Jawaharlal Nehru Planetarium, Bangalore and a professional Quiz Master. There were 5 rounds of 10 questions each posed to 10 groups. The Rounds focussed on Politics, Geography, Science, Cinema, Entertainment and Sports.

All the questions were well answered by the participants. Prizes were declared for four teams as first, second, third and consolation prize. Cash prizes and certificates were given to the winners and mementos were given to all the participants.

The second session was held from 11.30 to 12.30 pm, by Dr. S.T. Ramachandra, Member of CBR&WS and Hospital Committee. Dr. Ramachandra is associated with Krishik Sarvodaya Foundation Charitable Trust which coaches aspirants of IAS and KAS exams. He addressed the gathering, providing detailed information on how and what kind of competitive examinations graduate students can take, for suitable jobs. He

The programme concluded with a brief talk by the Hon. Secretary followed by the General Manager-CBR&WS. Both of them congratulated the students and advised them to study well and come up in life. They handed over prizes to the winners of the Quiz competition. Vote of thanks was rendered by the Senior Manager-Mathruchhaya.

Braille Writing and Quiz Competition

Mathruchhaya Braille Resource Centre conducted a Braille Writing and Quiz competition for visually challenged students studying in classes 7-10 on September 11, 2024.

Every year BRC conducts Braille Reading & Writing competitions. The event was organized to encourage the visually challenged students (who receive Braille books from us) in Braille Reading and to promote Quality Braille. In addition a multi-round quiz competition was also held & the same was enjoyed by the students. This year's competition provided a valuable opportunity for us to gather feedback from students and teachers about the Braille books supplied by BRC.

27 students from Shri. Ramana Maharshi Academy for the Blind, Karnataka Welfare Association for the Blind and Deepa Academy for Differently Abled, all from Bengaluru, participated in the competition.

The program was compered and led by BRC senior volunteer Smt. Rakhi Aithal. The students were divided into two groups, one for English dictation and the second for Kannada dictation. Senior volunteers Smt. Vinoda and Smt. Shylaja dictated the English and Kannada passages respectively. Students enthusiastically wrote them down using their Braille slates and stylus.

Following this, the students were divided into 7 groups of 4 members each for the Quiz. The Quiz was divided into 5 rounds namely: Math Reading, Jumbled words, Find the Odd one out, Audio Round and Pick and Speak.

Each round lasted for 20 minutes but the participants answered the questions much faster. Two volunteers per team were there to assist with questions and keep score. Students actively participated in the Quiz. Before the prize distribution, the students showcased their exemplary talents in singing and entertained the listeners.

Shri. Siddalinga Swamy, Dr. Ravi Arjun and Shri. K.S.S. Kamath, GM, CBR&WS, gave away the prizes to the winners of Braille Writing and Quiz competition. Smt. Educational Sponsorship Programme: Inspiring Students to Aim for a Better Goal

Mathruchhaya sponsors several Students from lower income group families, to continue their studies. Apart from the monetory help, Mathruchhaya focusses on the all-round development of each student by organizing many activities and refresher classes.

During the current academic year we have sponsored around 300 students for their education.

Commencing from June 2024, Mathruchhaya had a collaboration with **U&I Trust**, an India-based, volunteer-driven organization that aims to bring about a change in our communities. Started in 2011, U&I Trust drives positive change in education, child and women's welfare, and mental health. U&I does two activities - **U&I Teach** and **U&I Care** - impacting over 4000 students across India every single week through their





network of 3000 volunteers. Their goal is that the children should excel in the classroom and beyond, eventually breaking out of the cycle of poverty. "U&I Teach" operates with the mission of ensuring high-quality education for underprivileged students so that they lead successful lives.

Students attend these coaching sessions on Saturdays and get totally involved in the activities they conduct. Mathruchhaya is grateful for the activities and commitment of U&I.
